Safeguarding

Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility in school, and we take this very seriously. Keeping your child safe is our primary concern. Parents Forum

We had a good turn out for the most recent Parents Forum and I would like to thank each of those who attended. There was a number of useful discussions and suggestions to help make Peel Park a better place to be. Amongst the topics discussed was parking, reading books and rewards in school.

A summary of the discussions are below:

Reading books- It was reported that a number of children were not having their books changed regularly and, in some cases, the books seemed too easy. Since the meeting there has been a staff meeting focused on reading, the staff have been asked to change books more frequently and a member of the senior leadership team is currently reviewing the systems in place. Mr Waites also reminded parents of the importance of enjoying any reading material, including magazines, non-fiction books or comics from home. As long as it promotes children's enjoyment of reading then class teachers will be happy. If you feel that your child's reading book is too easy for them, please do not hesitate to speak to your child's class teacher.

Parking- A lengthy discussion occurred regarding the parking issues around school. This has been reported to the local council a number of times and more signage has been ordered for the front of school. Mr Waites explained he tries to ensure an increased presence around the front and side of school but it is a difficult situation to manage. Please can we ask that all parents try to show consideration when parking and, if you are able, please park as far away from school as possible as this will ease congestion around the school. This will help ensure our main priority which is the safety of the children in our school.

Rewards- A discussion was had around the rewards that our children receive within school. Mr Waites mentioned that our staff team, including teachers and teaching assistants had given consideration to the bronze, silver and gold reading badges that we awarded to the children last year. This system was also discussed with parents. A unanimous decision was that the badges will discontinue with immediate effect. Instead of the badges, there will be a weekly certificate given to a child in each class who has shown a strength in their reading in that particular week. This could be for most improved, or reading a different genre, or simply having the courage to read aloud in the class for the first time. Mr Waites reassured the parents group that this change does not mean that we don't value the children's reading at home, the decision was made with the belief we are further highlighting the enjoyment of reading as more children in our school will have the opportunity to be rewarded for their improvement. These certificates will start after half-term and will be awarded on a Friday alongside the values certificates.
