We have a number of children
who arrive at school
unaccompanied and are
making poor choices on the
playground. We do not allow
any games of football or tig
before school, as there aren't any
adults to support in case of
accidents. We also don't allow
any balls on any of the
playgrounds, as it is difficult to
manage while we have other
parents trying to come into
school.

Please, can I ask you to speak to your children about this period of time and accompany them to school if possible? If this isn't possible, then we will continue to address issues before school as they arise.

Spring term 2024

As always at Peel Park, we really value the impact that parents and carers can have on the children within our school. It is for that reason that we had a themed 'Thrive Week' that celebrated the work that our whole school community is doing to support the 'whole child'. It was good to see everyone get involved and attend our sessions in school.

This week we also had a parents e-safety session, which gave some really practical advice on how to keep your child safe online when at home. As you will know, this is a very complex area, and while it was focused on e-safety at home, this can often spill into school and become something that we have to deal with too.

On another note, staff from school are beginning the final preparations to take large groups of our children on our annual residential trips. Our year six children are going to Tower Wood Centre next week to take part in many outdoor and adventurous activities, including hiking, canoeing, and power boating. The week after, I will be part of a staff team of six who will be accompanying nearly 60 year-five children on their annual trip to London. While there, we will be visiting many of the sites, taking in a west-end show, and having our own boat trip on the River Thames.

As always with these things and all things that happen within school, it is the dedication and commitment of the staff team that allows them to happen, so I would like to say a big thank you to them for continuing to give their all for the 622 children of our school!

Swimming Pool coming soon!

Peel Park is soon to get its first ever swimming pool on our school site! Arriving during the Easter holidays and staying with us for six weeks, we will have a swimming pool for the sole use of our children, and it will be placed on our EYFS playground. It is heated, 10 metres long, and will be a real asset for our children while it is here.

Given that it is just for us, we are hoping that **ALL CHILDREN** will have the opportunity to swim in it at some point. Some of our older children have a greater opportunity so that they can try to meet the national curriculum standard before they leave our school (25m).

We will be sending a letter out to all parents and carers in the next couple of weeks, but, for your information, all children who have the opportunity will need to bring appropriate equipment on their designated day: a **swimming costume** (for girls), swimming shorts (for boys), flip-flops (or equivalent) and a large towel. More information will be on the letter,

and a full timetable will be sent out nearer the time. I am sure that the children will love it, and hopefully it is something that we can commit to annually from this point forward.

While the pool is in place, all access to the EYFS playground will be restricted, and parents and carers will need to use another entrance and exit into the school.
