Red Y6 uniform

This will give all parents and carers the opportunity to come into school and discuss the progress of each of your children and the next steps in their learning.

Children trespassing

We continue to have a problem with local people accessing the school site after school. All of these people are accessing the site illegally and are ignoring the posters around school that state that it is trespassing. In order to get access, these people are jumping over high fences and putting themselves at risk. A number of these people, when challenged, are also being abusive and threatening towards members of staff.

On Saturday 16th March, we had considerable damage caused to our EYFS outdoor area by trespassers. This has caused distress to the children who first saw it when they arrived on Monday morning. This damage has now been rectified, **at cost to the school.**

The school continues to call the police on every occasion, and they have visited the site a number of times. We are hoping that this will be an extra deterrent.

Please, can I ask you to support us with this by speaking to your own children about accessing sites illegally. If you suspect that one of your own children is doing this, please ensure that it does not continue. **Please can I also ask, if you see anyone on the school site after the school day, to ring the police yourselves and log it as a crime?** We don't want any further damage to school property and the resources that we are providing for the children of Peel Park Primary School.

Bees at Peel Park Primary School

Having conducted a lot of research (including linking with a local headteacher) to understand the many benefits of having our own bees, I am now in a position to tell you that we are soon to have a delivery of Peel Park's first swarm!

Our bees will be managed and maintained by the Forest School staff, with the support of a team of beekeeper children. They will be based in a quiet corner of the school grounds, and we are hoping that, in time, they will be producing enough honey for us to use in the kitchen and sell to our school community.
